

## **OAR 333-008 Revision History Summary**

as of 12-15-2005

### **Permanent April 29, 1999**

Attending physician defined as a Doctor of Medicine (MD) or Doctor of Osteopathy (DO) licensed under ORS chapter 677 who has primary responsibility for the care and treatment of a person diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition.

### **Temporary August 10, 2001 through January 31, 2002**

Attending physician defined as a physician who has established a physician/patient relationship with the patient, is licensed under ORS chapter 677, and who, with respect to a patient diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition:

- (a) is primarily responsible for the care and treatment of the patient;
- (b) is primarily responsible for recognized, medical specialty care and treatment of the patient;
- (c) has been asked to consult and treat the patient by the patient's primary care physician; or,
- (d) has reviewed a patient's medical records at the patient's request, has conducted a thorough physical examination of the patient, has provided a treatment plan and/or follow-up care, and has documented these activities in a patient file.

### **Permanent March 25, 2002**

Attending physician defined as a physician who has established a physician/patient relationship with the patient, is licensed under ORS chapter 677, and who, with respect to a patient diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition:

- (a) Is primarily responsible for the care and treatment of the patient;
- (b) Is primarily responsible for providing medical specialty care and treatment of the patient as recognized by the American Board of Medical Specialties;
- (c) Has been asked to consult and treat the patient by the patient's primary care physician who is licensed under ORS 677, a Physician Assistant licensed under ORS 677, or a Nurse Practitioner licensed under ORS 678; or,
- (d) Has reviewed a patient's medical records at the patient's request, has conducted a thorough physical examination of the patient, has provided or planned follow-up care, and has documented these activities in the patient's medical record.

### **Permanent July 1, 2003**

Attending physician defined as a physician who has established a physician/patient relationship with the patient, is licensed under ORS chapter 677, and who, with respect to a patient diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition:

- (a) Is primarily responsible for the care and treatment of the patient;
- (b) Is primarily responsible for providing medical specialty care and treatment of the patient as recognized by the American Board of Medical Specialties;

(c) Has been asked to consult and treat the patient by the patient's primary care physician who is licensed under ORS Chapter 677, a Physician Assistant licensed under ORS Chapter 677, or a Nurse Practitioner licensed under ORS Chapter 678; or,

(d) Has reviewed a patient's medical records at the patient's request, has conducted a thorough physical examination of the patient, has provided or planned follow-up care, and has documented these activities in the patient's medical record.
